THE SALE OF LIMERICK.

FOURTH DAY'S RESULTS.

Total Over £95,000.

Thursday's sale of the ground rents was again remarkably successful, all lots, with a single exception, being disposed of after keen competition. The figures for the day were over £14,000, bringing the total up to £95,092. There has certainly never been so extensive or so successful a sale held in this country, and the auctioneers, Messrs. James H. North and Co., are to be congratulated on the result of their efforts. They were materially helped by the manner in which the rental was turned out by Messrs. Barrington and Son, solicitors for the Earl of Limerick, by whose instructions the rents are being sold. At Thursday's sale a large number of the lots were so arranged as to enable tenants to compete for their holdings, and this they did successfully in practically every instance.
