FRENCH RAILWAY DISASTER.

Reuter's Bordeaux representative cables that the number of people killed in the railway disaster on Saturday night at Contras was ten. The accident is attributed by witnesses to the error of a pointsman. The Press Association Wellingboro' correspondent telegraphs that Mr. and Mrs. Warwick James, of Wellingboro', parents of Mr. Egbert James, solicitor, one of the Englishmen injured in the accident at Contras, received yesterday morning a wire from their son, who is in hospital in Paris, stating that he had escaped with a hurt foot. Mr. William Aloysius Bradley, Principal of Wellingboro' Technical Institute, who was also in the accident, has had a broken leg.

FALL FROM A SWING.

Fatal Result

(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)

The Coroner for West Limerick held an inquest on Monday evening on the body of a girl named Mary Morony, an inmate of the Glin Industrial Schools, aged 14, who fell from a swing on Saturday evening, receiving injuries which terminated fatally in a few minutes. Medical and other testimony having been given, the following verdict was returned:—"That Mary Morony died from the effects of the fall received from the defective swing, cause of death being fracture of the base of the skull."

ROBBED ON PUBLIC ROAD.

An outrage of a very unusual character has been committed near Banagher. It appears that while a farmer named James Horan, his niece, Kathleen O'Shaughnessy, and his nephew were driving along the road about 11 o'clock p.m. they were stopped at Lismagh Bridge, a short distance from Banagher, by five men whom they had overtaken. After several stones had been thrown the men came nearer and belaboured Horan with sticks. His arms were covered with bruises, while his head and face were badly cut. A purse containing 30s was snatched from the girl. The money was extracted from the purse, and she succeeded in recovering the latter, but did not get the money.

In connection with the affair three men named Corcoran, White and M'Guinness, were arrested and brought before the magistrates at Banagher, when it was stated that Corcoran had left a publichouse under the influence of drink on the same evening. White and M'Guinness could not be identified, and they were discharged, while
