HOOKING ACCIDENT:

THREE MEN KILLED.

Dangerous Position of Eleven.

A hooking accident occurred at the Shirebrook colliery, near Mansfield, this morning. The cage containing 14 men was descending the shaft when one of the strands of the conductor became loose. As a result the cage was jerked almost down, and three of the men were pitched to the pit's bottom. The eleven men managed to hang on to the cage. All the men thrown from the cage were killed, with one exception the others were able to be sent home.

MURDERED HIS SON-IN-LAW.

Hanged This Morning.

At Stafford this morning, Joseph Jones, stocker, was hanged for the murder of Edmund K. at Quarry Bank, by battering his head and cutting his throat on December 1st. Jones was the father-in-law, and lived with him and relations were frequent.

TRAIN SMASH.

Narrow Escape.

A passenger train on the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway when approaching Newton Heath Station, near Manchester, shortly before midnight, took points leading to a siding. The engine smashed the stop block, and finally turned. The passengers, who numbered at fifty, were all more or less shaken, and a gentleman sustained concussion of the brain. The siding is on a steep embankment, the whole train had a narrow escape.
