

TRADE IN PEWTERS.

At the City Petty Sessions yesterday, an elderly man named Michael Bourke was charged with the larceny of a pewter pint from Mr. Martin Clohessey's licensed premises.

A son of the publican placed a value of 4s. 6d. on the measure, and said thirteen had been taken within the past twelve months.

MADE COMPENSATION.

Decision Reversed by Consent

John McGarry, Henry street, Kilmush, answered to his bails on appeal at the Kilmush Quarter Sessions on Thursday on a sentence of 32 days with hard labour imposed on him by the Kilmush magistrates on the 11th of February for a violent assault on Mr. Patrick Bourke, D.C., who had received severe injuries as a result. When the case was called, Mr. Hilliard, solr., said McGarry had made ample compensation to Mr. Bourke since the sentence. They were always friends, and he hoped the Court would accept these assurances of regret and compensation for what took place in a fit of drunkenness. Mr. Kelly, solicitor for Mr. Bourke, consented, and the judge for the purpose of retaining the good relationship between them reversed the decision of the Court below by consent.
