## IRISHTOWN WARD VACANCY.

At half-past nine last night the result of the election for Councillorship of the Irishtown Ward was made known. Four candidates presented themselves for election, namely—Richard Smyth (carpenter), Patrick Rielly (chimney cleaner), James Cross (stoker), and John Sheehan (composer). The declaration, which was made in presence of a small gathering was as follows:—Smyth, 263; Cross, 158; O'Rielly, 55; Sheehan, 25.

Mr. Smyth was declared elected, and thanked his supporters, as did also the unsuccessful candidates. A vote of thanks was tendered to the presiding officers for the successful manner in which they had discharged their duties.

There were 12 spoilt papers out of a poll of 519 voters, or 112 less than the number on the register.
