DEATH OF MR. PATRICK RIORDAN.

The death took place on Thursday afternoon
of Mr. Patrick Riordan, William street, after
an illness of considerable duration, patiently
borne. The deceased gentleman had attained
the fine age of 75 years, and during his long life
had rendered signal services to the Municipality
with whose fortunes, he was inseparably con-
nected for a very long number of years. He
was an ardent politician, and during the year
he occupied the civic chair—in 1891—threw in
his lot with the adherents of Parnell. Although
a man of unswerving loyalty to his principles,
the deceased who was also Alderman of the
Market Ward, always acted straightforwardly
with those who differed from him. In the
capacity of gas manager, to which
position he was elected about eleven years ago.
Mr. Riordan's tenure of the office was marked
with success. By his demise the city is deprived
of a gentleman who formed a link with the past,
and a charming and affable personality. He
leaves a large family to mourn his loss, and to
whom the sympathy of the public goes out in
their bereavement.

The Funeral.

Last evening at half-past six the remains were
transferred from St. John's Hospital, where
death took place, to St. Michael's R.C. Church,
where they rested overnight, and this morning at
10 o'clock solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated
for the dead. There was a large con-
gregation present, and at the conclusion
of the service the coffin was taken out
to the hearse, and the funeral cortege started
for Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery. Despite
the inclemency of the morning a very large and
influential cortege followed the bier to the last
resting place, and thus signified the respect and
esteem entertained for the deceased gentleman
by all classes and creeds.
