THE WHALE AND THE WHALER.

Exciting Experience.

The Grimsby trawler Salvia reached port on Tuesday, and the skipper reported having picked up the crew of the Norwegian steam whaler Dimon, which was discovered in a crippled condition off Faroe. While whale hunting off Mayness, the Dimon encountered a huge whale, which, after being harpooned, smote the steamer such a terrible blow that her plates were stove in, and the engine room filling with water, she almost foundered. The Salvia arrived in time to save the nine hands, and tow the almost totally submerged craft into Nestmann's Haven.
