## EMIGRANT TRAIN IN COLLISION.

### 300 in Danger.

The Press Association telegraphs—At Woodhouse Junction, near Sheffield, on the Great Central a train with three hundred persons collided with a goods train. The guard of the latter was killed, and the fireman and driver of the emigrant special were badly injured, while one of the passengers, a German, also received a scalp wound. Both engines overturned, and the traffic was blocked, but it is expected the line will be cleared during the morning.
