DEATH OF MR. J. JOYCE.

We regret to record the death of Mr. John Joyce, which took place at his residence, Cecil street, yesterday morning. The deceased, who was uncle of Alderman Joyce, M.P., had just reached his seventieth year, and was the oldest working pilot in Limerick district. For half a century he had been piloting for the Harbour Commissioners, and during that long interval of time his attention to duty was most marked. By the Commissioners he was held in the highest esteem, and by his colleagues in the service, no man enjoyed a wider share of popularity. The funeral will leave St. Michael's R.C. Church tomorrow at 3 o'clock for Mount St. Laurence Cemetery.

DEATH

OF MR. H. C. CULLINAN, B.L.

We regret extremely to observe the announcement which appears in our obituary column this evening of the death of Mr. Henry Cooke-Cullinan, B.L., which took place to-day at Ennis. The deceased gentleman had been ill for the past month or six weeks, but the news of his demise will come as a great shock to his numerous friends in this city and in the South of Ireland generally. Called to the Bar in the Trinity Term of 1890, Mr. Cullinan soon proved himself a very able and brilliant advocate, and enjoyed an extensive practice both at the Civil and Criminal side of the Court on the Munster Circuit and in the Metropolis. He was a well known and popular figure in the Assize and Quarter Sessions Courts in Limerick and Clare, and the cutting short of a bright career at the early age of 41 years will be deeply regretted by all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance. We tender to his relatives our sincere sympathy.
