CLARE LUNATIC ASYLUM.

(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)

Rev. A. Clancy, P.P., Chairman, presided at the monthly meeting of the Committee of Management of the Clare Lunatic Asylum this week. There were also present—Rev. John Garry, P.P.; Messrs. P. J. Linnane, J.P.; M. Considine, P. C. Nagle, Daniel O'Loughlin, M. Lynch, P. E. Moloney, and James O'Regan, J.P.

Dr. F. O'Mara, R.M.S., Dr. T. A. Greene, Assistant Medical Officer, Messrs. John Epright, and F. G. Kerin, solicitor, were in attendance. MONTHLY REPORT.

In his monthly report, Dr. O'Mara said that owing to the serious illness of one of the female attendants he had to engage a trained nurse to attend her, and owing to the continued illness of a male attendant he had engage a substitute.

IRISH INDUSTRIES.

A letter was read from the All-Ireland Industrial Conference stating that the Galway Industrial Development Association were making arrangements for this year's conference in Galway, and asking to have delegates appointed to attend.

Mr. O'Regan said that he was at the Conference in Limerick, and it was an undoubted success. The Galway Conference deserved their support. He proposed the rev. chairman and Mr. Nagle be the delegates.

This was agreed to.

THE PURCHASE OF ADDITIONAL LAND.

A letter was read from Mr. T. J. Hunt, solr., on behalf of Mr. Mat Monahan, inquiring when the Committee would complete the purchase of the additional land they had proposed to acquire from him. The terms were £155, and £7 for damages prior to purchase. He had since paid rent and rates, while he had not been able to use the land as before, and he asked a further \$5 on this account.

Dr. O'Mara said that the application for the loan for the land had gone in with that for the loan for the sewerage works to the County Council, and he did not know what way the application went at the County Council, but it was sanctioned by the Lord Lieutenant.

It was decided to request the Local Government Board to sanction and issue the loan for the purchase of this land, as it was separate from the sewerage loans.

LUNATIC ESTATES.

Rev. Fr. Garry moved a resolution that the management of all lunatic estates within the jurisdiction of the Co. Court of Clare be handed over to Mr. F. G. Kerin, their solicitor, and that a report on the estates of all such lunatics be submitted to Mr. Kerin by the R.M.S. on admission.

Rev. Fr. Garry said this would save a considerable amount. At present such estates were
