of Mr. Kenny, who at the triennial election in June last was returned as representative on the Limerick County Council for the Glia County Electoral Division.
 The petitioner, who was a candidate at the same election, bases his petition on the ground that respondent being convicted without the option of a fine and sentenced to a month's hard labour on the 31st March, 1904, was disqualified ipso facto from acting as a representative on the County Council. Having regard to that, the petitioner claimed the seat, as the electors were cognisant of respondent's disqualification.
 Mr. Kenny, K.C., with Mr. Phelps, B.L. (instructed by Mr. Kenny, solicitor, Limerick), represented the petitioner.
 Respondent was represented by Mr. Kelly, B.L. (instructed by Mr. Liston, solicitor).
 The Attorney-General was represented by Mr. James S. Gaffney, solicitor.
 Mr. Kenny, in stating the case for the petitioner, observed that on the night of the 2nd February, 1904, the respondent threw a stone through the window of the petitioner's house, and on the 31st March of the same year he was convicted and sentenced to a month's imprisonment without the option of a fine. Counsel contended that being the case, the respondent was disqualified, and by reason of the fact being published in the newspapers the electors had knowledge of it, and were cognisant of his disqualification. His client, therefore, claimed the seat and drew the Commissioner's attention to the law on the matter. He quoted the Privy Council Order bearing on the disqualification of candidates from public office, and which went to show that imprisonment without the option of a fine deprived the offender of civic rights for a period of five years. Counsel read extracts from the newspapers on the respondent's conviction; also the memorial of the County Council to the Lord Lieutenant praying for a remission of the sentence, and asking that the disabilities, which followed the conviction, be removed.
 The Commissioner asked Counsel if he placed any significance in the fact that these papers had accounts of these things in 1904?
 Mr. Kenny said not, and referred the Commissioner to the Mitchell petition case, and the Trench and Nolan case in support of his arguments.
 Mr. Edmond J. Mitchell, Returning Officer at the recent elections, swore that the poll was declared on the 4th June. There were four nominations—J. M. O'Shaughnessy, Patrick O'Shaughnessy, Francis Fitzgerald, and David Ruddle. Witness received notice from petitioner on the 11th May, stating that the respondent was disqualified to hold or occupy the position of County Councillor.
 John Morgan, Dunmoyian, deposed to having heard that the respondent was sent to gaol for a month for throwing stones at the petitioner's house. In his district this was a matter of common report.
 The enquiry adjourned until 11 o'clock this morning.
