HUNTING.

THE CLARE STAG HOUNDS.

Owing to the wet state of the country last week the meet at Ballycar was cancelled, but hounds met at Ballycunneen on Friday under very favourable weather conditions, when an excellent day's sport was enjoyed. One of the red deer had made his escape a few days previously out of the exercise ground, jumping a garden wall some ten feet high, an almost incredible feat, and was located in this neighbourhood. Hounds found the outlyer at once, and this fine stag (one of Lord de Freyne's) was soon on foot, leaving the covert for the open country, making for Firgrove, passing through the lawn in front of the hall door, and on to Clomoney. Wheeling to the right at Ballycreevy, hounds went at a great pace over a fine country skirting Rinanagh, passing close to Drumline Castle; on towards Rathlabine, and then bearing to the right almost into Woodpark, when after a very brilliant 35 minutes a safe capture was effected. A hind was afterwards set at liberty, and gave a nice hunt of about five miles. Strangely enough this capture took place at Firgrove, as if by some mysterious compact with the sporting owner, whose lavish hospitality awaited all comers, and was largely availed of by the field, bringing to a close a very
