

HUNTING.

THE CLARE STAG HOUNDS.

. Qwing to the wet state of the country last week the meet at Ballycar was cancelled, but bounds met at Ballycunneen on Friday under very favourable weather conditions, when an excellent day's sport was enjoyed. One of the red deer had made this escape a few days previously out of the everoise ground, jumping a garden wall some ten feet high, an almost inoredible feat, and was located in this neighbour-Hounds found the outlyer at once, and hood. this fine stag (one of Lord de Freyne's) WAS foot, BOOD on leaving the covert for the open country, Firgrove, passing through the laws in front of the halldeor, and on to Cloamoney.
