FUNERAL OF MR. P. HERRIOTT.

The remains of the late Mr. Patrick Herriott were interred yesterday morning in Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery in presence of a large gathering of mourners. The death occurred on Wednesday night at the New Barracks, of Sapper William Sturges, of the Royal Engineers.
