A telegram from Melilla states that the Moors attacked the Spanish forces yesterday, and appear to have suffered severely. The Spanish losses were slight.

The death is reported of Colonel Edward O'Brien, the head of the family which claims descent from the one time kings of Ireland. The deceased was ninety-four years of age.

"He used awful language to me, sir ; but I won't tell you what he said, because I am not a good scholar," said a woman at Cardiff Police Court.

The National Union of Conservative and Constitutional Associations are organising a further campaign throughout the country, and on September 6th will despatch thirty vans, which will tour forty counties.

The number of schools and modern educational establishments the closing of which has been ordered by the civil Governor at Barcelona is 94. Three commissaries and four policemen have been dismissed.

The Cunard Royal mail steamer *Lucretia*, from New York on Wednesday last, with passengers, mails, and specie, arrived at Queens-town at 2.43 p.m. yesterday. She landed the Irish mails and a large number of passengers, and proceeded for Liverpool immediately.

A Reuter's message from Mexico yesterday states—Troops this morning left Monterey, Sotillo and Montmorcos for Galena, where General Reyes, ex-President of Colombia, is said to be hiding. It is added that his arrest is probable.

A Reuter's telegram from Paris yesterday states that General Brun, Minister for War, left last evening with his staff for Chalons Camp. To-morrow he will witness the manoeuvres of the First Cavalry Division, and will meet General Sir John French.

Reuter's Agency is informed by the Consul General of Salvador in London that there is no truth in the statement published in the English Press to the effect that a tax of £10 sterling is now levied upon all commercial travellers visiting the Republic.

A meeting of the Scotch Coal Trade Conciliation Board was held at Glasgow yesterday afternoon to complete the arrangements for the wages agreement which was arrived at in London recently. Among other subjects discussed was the appointment of a neutral chairman. The board ultimately adjourned until September 13th.
