

the Administration of the Greenland Colonies passed Lerwick to-day at noon, having aboard the Inspector of Greenland. The latter has tele-Inspector of Greenland. The latter has tele-graphed from Lerwick to the Administration in Copenhagen as follows:—" Have aboard the American explorer, Dr. Gook, who reached the North Pole on April 21, 1901, while on a North Polar expedition. Cook arrived May 19, 1909, at Upernivik from Cape York. Eskimos at York confirm truth of Coek's journey."

Reuter's Agency states that Lerwick, from which this remarkable announcement has reached Copenhagen, is, of course, the chief tow of the Shetland Islands, which lie in the route of the steamer returning to Copenhagen from Greenland. Upernivik, which was stated was eventually reached by Dr. Cook, is on the west coast of Greenland, in Baffin Bay. Is is inhabited by Eskimos. For two years the absence of Dr. Cook has been a source of anxiety. He started off in February, 1908, from Etab, in search of the North Pole, accompanied by a single companion, M. Randolph Francke. The latter returned to St. John's, Newfoundland, in October, 1908, by the Peary steamer Erik, and reported that Dr. Cook had set off in the previous February. Subsequently he had had a letter from the bold explorer, brought by Eskimos. It was dated March 17, from Cape Columbia, the northernmost part of Grinnel Land, west of Greenland. He reported that he was just about to venture on to the Arctic Floe in the Polar Basin. From that mement until to-day nothing has been heard of the intrepid voyager. His friends arranged that the Jeanle, which is an auxiliary of the Peary Expedition, and which sailed en August 3rd from St. John's, should bring him south from Etab, if he could be found. Dr. F. A. Cook is from Brooklyn.

DR. COOK AND HIS DISCOVERY.

(BY TELEGRAPH.

Paris, Thursday—The "New York Herald,' Paris edition, to-day publishes the first instalment of an account of the discovery of the North Pole, telegraphed by Dr Cook. He says—"The new route was followed, and we discovered land on which are the northernmost rocks of the world. We have reclaimed a triangle of thirty-six square miles of unknown land. The cold was severe, and the men suffered cruelly. The temperature fell to eighty-three degrees below zero centigrade. We began our journey on the Polar Sea on March 18th."
