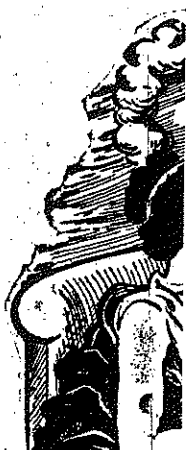

## TOLERATION IN WESTMEATH.

### Co-operation in Technical Education.

At the meeting of the Westmeath Protestant Orphan Society, the Rev. Dr. White, Warden of Wilson's Hospital, Multyfarham, in moving a resolution that the Society is worthy of the earnest and liberal support of the Church of Christ, and recording thanks to God for the successful career of the Society for sixty-eight years, said he would like to congratulate the Society and the meeting on the tone of the speeches that day. He remembered a time when a Protestant Orphan Society meeting was regarded as a favourite occasion for a sort of controversial pyrotechnical display. (Laughter) There used to be an amount of rather noisy fireworks of this description going up, charged at times with very uncomplimentary matter to fellow-Christians of other Churches. Thank God, that sort of thing appeared to be gone. One of the speakers there spoke of it as their duty as Church-people and as citizens not to throw any obstacle in the way of the success and betterment of anyone, no matter of what politics or religion, but seeing at the same time that the members of their own Church got full and fair and equal chances. He agreed with this, and he could also say it was a great pleasure to him to be able to speak there of the toleration and catholic spirit evinced towards them by their Roman Catholic fellows in that County of
