### LANGUAGE PROCESSION.

### CINEMATOGRAPH EXHIBITIONS.

Sheffield Licensing Justices have decided to impose stringent regulations on all places of entertainment where cinematograph exhibitions are given. All such places of entertainment are to be connected by telephone with the fire station, and the licensee is to pay the cost of a city fireman's being in attendance during every performance. In every case the chief constable is to be satisfied that all reasonable precautions have been taken against accident and danger to the public. The cinematograph is to stand in a box constructed entirely of metal and asbestos, fitted with automatic doors and shutters; and the machine is to be cleaned and examined every day.

### FUNERAL OF A LIMERICK LADY.

The funeral of the late Miss Corbett, sister of the Roman Catholic Bishop of Sale, Australia, took place to-day from the railway station for interment in the family burial place, Mount St Lawrence. Miss Corbett was residing at a convent in Kilkenny, and she had been ailing for some time past. She was a member of an old Limerick family, of whom her brother, the Bishop in Australia, is perhaps the sole survivor. Rev. F. Reeves, P.P., Tournafula, a relative of the deceased, and who accompanied the remains from Kilkenny, officiated at the graveside. There was a large attendance of clergy and laity.
