## ROAD PROPOSALS

### At Limerick County Council.

At the meeting of the Limerick County Council on Saturday, Mr W. R. Gubblings, J.P. chairman, presiding, with regard to a proposal to repair an old road at Rathaney, between Milton and Knocklong, in the Kilmallock Rural District, which at one end did not open into a public road,

The County Surveyor said he wrote to the Roscommon County Surveyor, touching a case where the legality of repairing a cul de sac was questioned, and where compulsory powers were sought. The Judge decided that it was a case where public money could not legally be expended. That case, said Mr Horan, was identical with the one the Council had been dealing with.

The proposal was accordingly disallowed. Other proposals coming under the same head were also disallowed.

#### A PATH NEEDED.

Mr. Bennett advocated the construction of a path commencing at the cross where the road from Kilmallock to Bruff branches to Bruree. He moved that it be constructed.

The Chairman seconded.

Mr. Coleman moved, and Mr. J. M. Ryan seconded, that the path be not constructed, but that as it was a half county charge, that it be adjourned for the result of the recent inquiry.

On a show of hands Mr. Bennett's motion was declared carried by 12 votes to 8.

Several other works of a like nature were adjourned pending the result of the recent main roads inquiry at Limerick.

#### PATH TO ST. LAWRENCE CEMETERY.

The proposal to flag the footpath at Blackboy Pike from Wakhe's crossing to the Cemetery gate, at an estimated cost of £49, was reached. The work was to be constructed, half off county and half off district rate. The cemetery authorities had undertaken to defray part of sum for the carrying out of this work.

An objection was raised, and on a poll the construction of the work was passed by a vote of 15 to 7.

## CO. LIMERICK HOUNDS.

Hunting with the County Limerick Hounds has been suspended since last Wednesday. This

alleged wrongful prevention as a bar to all claim by the plaintiff. Messrs H. D. Conner, K.C., and E. J. Phelps (instructed by Messrs F. M. Fitt and Co.), appeared for the plaintiff.

Messrs C. F. Doyle, K.C., and Mr. Corbett (instructed by Mr George F. Corbett) appeared for the defendant.

Mr Justice Dodd gave judgment for the plaintiff.
