Even if no settlement is reached to-day there is the possibility of the strike being deferred, the men continuing upon day-to-day contracts after the 31st instant. Prior to the Board assembling to-day each side held a private meeting. The strike has already had serious effects through a diversion of trade.

The Northumberland Miners' Executive to-day decided to pay a further strike allowance to the miners of the idle collieries till April 2nd.


