## VALUABLE DOG POISONED.

A valuable air-dale terrier the property of Capt.  
Frederick Hall, Inspector of Fisheries, under the  
Limerick Board of Conservators, was found  
poisoned at his residence Cappa, Kilrush, on  
Thursday morning, and the circumstances point to  
the act having been malicious. The dog had been  
on a chain in an enclosed garden for some days  
before. On Wednesday night Mr. Hall's house-  
keeper heard some disturbance outside the  
premises, and early on Thursday morning the  
animal was found lying on its back, sick, it  
apparently having got a strong dose of strychnine.  
Mr. Hall who was away from home at the time,  
has reported the matter to the police.
