They then finally changed the date of their fair to the 31st May, because they had no other date on which to hold it. They could not go into June for reasons-on account of Spaneilhill and one thing and another, They could not possibly have their fair on any other day but the 31st of May. They would be very sorry to interfere with the Kilrush fair in any way, but, unfortunately, they had absolutely no choice but to hold the fair on the 31st May, or not to hold it
