**NEW SOUTH WALES TRADE.**

The overseas imports of New South Wales February amounted to £2,214,000, an increase of £426,000 on the corresponding month of last year. The exports totalled £3,193,000. The value of imports for the first two months of the year amounted to £4,119,000, an increase of £737,000 on the corresponding period of 1910. The exports for January and February amounted to £5,014,000.
