THE HEALTH CONGRESS.

At the Health Congress in Dublin on Thursday importance of the proper and frequent disposal of town refuse was dwelt upon. It was stated that stable refuse should be removed frequently as being the breeding ground of flies, which conveyed infection. The adulteration of food was discussed, and stringent measures were urged. It was suggested that everyone dealing in any way with milk should be licensed, and it looked, said one speaker, that the time had arrived when we should have qualified shopkeepers and qualified shops. Government assistance towards the expense of food inspection at ports was also urged.
