**DEATH OF MR. JOHN BYRNE.**

We regret to record the death of an old citizen,  
 Mr. John Byrne, which took place at his...  
 residence, 62 Henry Street yesterday morning...  
 rather unexpectedly. The deceased had been out...  
 the previous day, and at night paid a visit to...  
 Thomondgate, where his sister-in-law, Mrs...  
 Sexton had died. While there he...  
 became suddenly ill, and proceeded home,  
 but there was nothing in his appearance...  
 to denote that his indisposition was other than...  
 passing. During the night, however, his con-...  
 dition became worse, and medical aid was...  
 requisitioned. Towards morning he began to...  
 sink, and at six o'clock he passed away. The...  
 late Mr. Byrne was an old and familiar figure in...  
 the city. His interests were chiefly bound up...  
 with the licensing trade, and in this connection...  
 he displayed an enterprise which was remarkable.  
 The fact of his death following so quickly on the...  
 demise of his sister-in-law lends a more mel-...
