COUNTY KILKENNY TRAGEDY.

Murder Charge.

Accused Sent for Trial.

Kilkenny, Monday.

At Kilkenny to-day, Patrick and Catherine Hayes and their son James were committed for trial charged with having murdered their employer, Edward Malone, at Mullinavat, on July 13th.

The body was found near where the parties resided, the deceased's head being beaten into pulp.
