## FUNERAL OF MASTER W. G. BURKE.

The remains of the late Master William Gerard Burke, eldest son of Mr. W. S. Burke, Editor of the *Munster News*, who passed away at his parents' residence on Wednesday, at the age of eight and a half years, and after a brief illness, were removed to St. Michael's R.C. Church on Thursday evening, and the funeral left yesterday at 10 a.m. for the family burial place at Killaloe.

The chief mourners were—Mr. W. S. Burke, father ; Messrs James, Joseph, and Anthony O'Dwyer (junior), uncles, and Malachy Hogan, cousin of the deceased.

The officiating clergy were—Father O'Connor, Adm., St. Michael's, and the Rev. Fr. Duane, C.C., do.

The journalistic colleagues and many other friends of Mr. Burke were present as a mark of sympathy with him and Mrs. Burke in their keen sorrow, which the unexpected death of their dearly loved son has occasioned. The cortege was joined at Killaloe by a large number of mourners from the town and district.
