SAD TRAP FATALITY.

Woman Killed Near Kilmallock.

A tragic event took place on Friday night at
 Ballygaddy. Mrs. Thomas Bohan, the wife of a
 farmer residing there, went on a visit to her
 sister, Mrs. Fleming, Sunville, Ardpatrick, where
 she left about 5.30 o'clock with a pony and trap.
 About 11 o'clock p.m. her dead body was found
 on a cushion near a fence on the roadside, within
 about half a mile of her home. One hundred and
 seventy yards further on the trap was upset, and
 the animal had got away from it.

THE INQUEST.

Coroner P. J. Cleary, M.D., with a jury, of
 which Mr. Thomas Clarkson was foreman, held an
 inquest on the body of Mrs. Bohan. Sergeant
 Quirk, Kilmallock, represented the authorities.

Mrs. Fleming, Sunville, stated that the deceased
 was at her house on Friday, and left about 5.30
 for home, driving a pony and trap. She did not
 complain of being ill.

Mr. Thomas Bohan, husband of deceased, de-
 posed that at about 9.45 the household went to
 bed, as they were not expecting her in conse-
 quence of the severity of the weather. About
 10.10 he was called by Mr. Dennison, who told
 the servant that the pony was at the gate with
 the harness on, but no car. Witness went along
 the road towards Ballygaddy chapel, and found
 the trap broken, and further on found his wife
 sitting by the fence, with the cushion under her
 head. She was dead. About three weeks ago
 she complained that she could not lie on her left
 side with an impression on her heart. She com-
 plained similarly on two occasions.

Dr. McNamara, J.P., deposed to examining
 the body. There were no marks on any part of
 it, and in his opinion death was due to syncope
 of the heart, and exposure to cold and wet
 during the severe storm that existed at the time
 she was returning home.

The jury found accordingly, and added a rider
 deeply sympathising with Mr. Bohan and friends
 in the great bereavement they had sustained.

EMPIRE'S WHEAT SUPPLY.

Interesting information regarding the wheat
 supply of this country is given in Part V. of the
 Board of Trade Agricultural Statistics, just
 issued. A comparison is made of the extension of
 the wheat area of the Empire and the growth of
 population since the census in 1901.

Taking the United Kingdom, Australia, Canada,
 India, and New Zealand as representing the
 Empire, a marked increase both of wheat area
 and population is shown in 1911. In each of the
 great divisions the extension of the wheat area
 has been much greater than that of the population.
