### FATAL ACCIDENT BALLINACURRA.

What proved a fatal accident occurred at allinacurra on Saturday afternoon. Two men-Patrick Sheehan and Michael Corbett work driving into town from Adare, and just approaching Balinacurra Bridge the large took fright, and Corbett, who was seated on one side if the car, jumped off, falling on his back, and susraining injuries which proved fatal subsequently, though at first the man did not realise he was seriously hurt, nor did he present the appearance of being such. After he fell off the oar Sheehan was able to hold his seat for some little distance, but close to the entrance to Mr. McDonnell's residence at Ballinacurra he too was thrown off the oar, and austained a fracture of the leg. Mrs. McDonnell had him kindly conveyed in her motor car to the County Infirmary, and Corbett was also attended to by some people passing into the city, one of whom conveyed him by car to town, with the view of going into hospital for treatment. Corbett, however, did not do so, and it was not until some hours later on that he was found again at Ballinacurra, whence he was brought in the ambulance to Barrington's Hospital, where he died at nine o'clock on Saturday night. Evidently the man was quite unaware of his condition, which, after he had walked about for some time, ended in his becoming unconscidits, that being his state when admitted to He was for some hours Barrington's. after the accident, apparently sensible, and those who noticed him towards evening were told by Corbett he was waiting for a car to bring him home. He gradually, however, became dazed. and come threatening the ambulance was sent for, as stated, and he was conveyed to hospital, continuing unsconscious until he died,

#### The Inquest.

An inquest was held last evening at Barrington's hospital as to the cause of death.

Acting Sergeant Crowley. Ballinocurra station, corducted the inquiry.

After hearing the evidence the jury found that death resulted from the injuries accidentally sustained, on the occasion of the occurrence.
