Mr. John Condon, solr., appeared for the accused.

At the inquest on the body of Mr Fitzgerald, held last Friday afternoon, medical evidence was given to the effect that the deceased died from disease of the lungs and valvular disease of the heart. They returned a verdict in accordance with the medical testimony.
