first the prisoner was arrested on a charge of causing serious bodily harm, and was allowed out on substantial bail, but since complications of a serious nature intervened, with the result that the accused has been re-arrested and brought up and remanded on the capital charge. Mr. John Condon, selr., appeared for the accused.

At the inquest on the body of Mr Fitzgerald, held last Friday afternoon, medical evidence was given to the effect that the deceased died from disease of the lungs and valvular disease of the heart. They returned a verdict in accordance with the medical testimony.
