HUMAN REMAINS EXPOSED.

Presumed Siege Relics.

While excavating at the Limerick Hay Market yesterday, some workmen came upon the remains of two bodies presumed to have been interred there about the time of the Williamite Siege. One of the skeletons, or what remained of it, was laid as if regularly interred, the other appeared to have been baried somewhat hurriedly. There was a hole in the side of the skull, within which a bullet was found, thereby showing that death was due to violence, and the remains those of a soldier killed at the siege. The unsuccessful assault of King William's army was made within some thre hundred yards from where the remains were discovered yesterday.
