HOME RULE DEMONSTRATION IN LIMERICK.

Last evening Alderman M. Joyce, M.P.,
received a telegram from Mr J. Devlin, M.P.,
asking if Sunday, 12th October next, would be a
suitable fixture for the Home Rule demonstration
in the city which is to be addressed by Mr John
Redmond, M.P., and other speakers. Alderman
Joyce replied in the affirmative, and the arrange-
ments necessary for the demonstration will in the
circumstances be made by the City Branch of the
United Irish League. Mr Redmond is announced
to speak at Cahiveen on Sunday, 28th instant,
and his pronouncement on the occasion is looked
forward to with considerable interest.

DEATH OF MR. J. P. McNAMARA.

We regret to record the death of an old and
highly esteemed citizen, Mr. Joseph P. McNamara,
which took place at his residence, 52 William-
street, yesterday after a brief illness. Mr. McNa-
mara had been in business for very many years,
and at one time was prominently identified with
public life, as a member of the old Corporation
and of the Board of Guardians (at which he fre-
quently presided as chairman) previous to the
passing of the Local Government Act. He was a
man of keen intelligence and sound business
capacity, while his invariable courtesy in public
and private life won for him the esteem of a wide
circle of friends, who have heard of his demise
with sincere regret, and sympathise with his
widow and relatives in their bereavement. There
will be Office and High Mass at St. Michael's
Church to-morrow at 10 a.m., and the funeral
takes place immediately after.
