#### £500 Damages.

The defendant denied the allegations, and said what occurred was with proper authority. The jury found for the plaintiff and awarded him £500 damage. Judgment was entered accordingly.

The Solicitor General, Mr Jonathan Pim, and Mr R M Hennessy, K.C., were elected new Benchers in room of the late Lord Ashbourne and the late Mr Justice Wright.

### SUDDEN DEATH IN THE CITY.

An inquest was held yesterday by Mr. J. F. Barry, City Coroner, into the circumstances attending the death of Mrs Bridget Flynn, which took place on Thursday. The remains were identified by Michael Flynn, mason, husband of the deceased, whom he said was about 46 years of age. Mary O'Neill, living next door, deposed to the deceased being in apparently good health at 1 o'clock, when she was singing around the house. Some time later she went in to see her, and found her dead in bed. The medical testimony given by Dr Shanahan attributed death to heart disease, and a verdict accordingly was returned. Sergeant Hawkins conducted the enquiry.
