DEATH OF MISS EILEEN GUERIN.

HENDON AVIATION FATALITY.

The inquest on Mr George Lee Temple, who was killed while flying at Hendon on Sunday, was held to-day. Deceased's father said the deceased was not in a fit state to fly, as he had been suffering from influenza. Witness declared on previous occasions his son's machine had been tampered with. DEATH OF LORD KNUTSFORD

The Press Association telegraphs—Viscount Knutsford passed away at his London residence this morning, after a brief illness, in his 71st year. The deceased nobleman was raised to the peerage in 1888, while Secretary of State for the Colonies, an office which he held from 1887 to 1892. In 1895 he was given a Viscountcy, and was trustee of the National Portrait Gallery, which office he succeeded in the title by his eldest son, Hon. Sydney Holland.

RAILWAY DIVIDENDS.
