DUBLIN LABOUR TROUBLES.

Men Present Themselves for Work.

No Vacancies for Many.

The Press Association wires—Following last
night's meeting at Liberty Hall, the dockers
presented themselves for employment at Dublin
to-day, but only about four hundred could be
re-instated, there being no vacancies for the larger
number.

Statement by Mr. W. M. Murphy.

Speaking at the Dublin Tramways meeting to-

of defeat and disaster. The strikes had added to the
Company's losses, but the result was worth the
sacrifice. It had proved the impossibility of
syndicalism succeeding when boldly grappled
