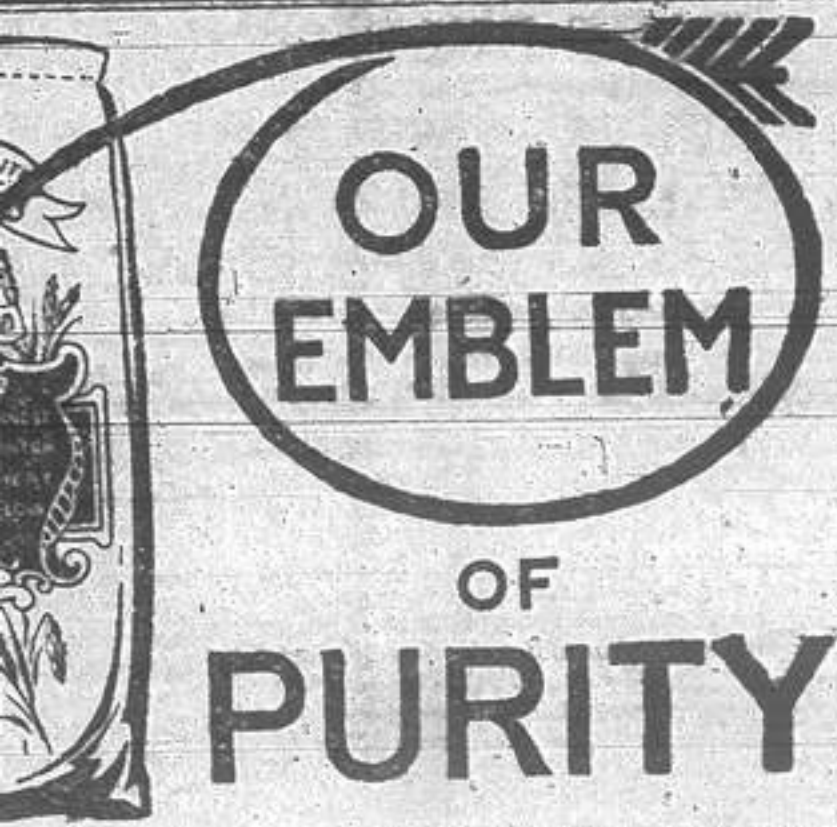

Poultry Keeping Scheme, 1913-14.
 List of Egg Distributing Stations (Hens and Ducks).

THE following persons have been selected by the above Committee to keep stations for the distribution of eggs of pure bred fowl, and persons living in the county can obtain eggs at 1s per sitting of 1 doz eggs for hen or duck eggs up to 31st May, 1914. Hen eggs will be sent by post at 1s 7d per sitting; duck eggs, 1s 8d; 2 doz hen eggs, 2s 11d; 2 doz duck eggs, 3s—boxes need not be returned. Infertile eggs will be replaced if returned within one month from date of distribution.—Mrs O'Brien, Drewscourt, Charleville—Barred Rocks. Miss
