## Rathkeale Town Commissioners

### VOTE OF CONDOLENCE.

At a special meeting of the above body, held at the Town Commissioners' Office on Thursday, Mr. Michael Madigan presided, and there were also present—Messrs. Patrick T. Liston, solicitor; John J. O'Mahony, M.C.C.; John F. Cosgreave, solicitor; William Ward and William Sheehan.

Mr. Liston proposed, and Mr. Cosgreave seconded, the following resolution, which was passed unanimously:—"That we beg to tender to our highly esteemed and much respected colleague, Dr. Magner, J.P., our condolence and sympathy on the death of his beloved mother, Mrs. Magner, Grange House, a lady deeply regretted by the poor and a large circle of friends."

## Popular Nationalist's Death

The death occurred on Saturday morning of Richard O'Brien, of Bank Place, Tipperary, who had been for about ten years a member of the Urban Council and Poor Law Board after the Local Government Act, of 1898, came into operation. He was a native of the town and a relative of the late Mr. K. E. O'Brien, M.P., and had reached an advanced age. He had been connected with the coal and cartage business, and in his time had been a consistent attendant at Nationalist meetings and was president of the Sarsfield Fife and Drum Band.

## Mandamus Against Council

On Friday, in the King's Bench Division, before the Lord Chief Justice, Mr Justice Kenny, and Mr Justice Dodd, Mr Frederick Mooney (instructed by Mr Arnold Power) applied on behalf of the Tipperary (North Riding) County Council for a conditional order of mandamus directed against the Nenagh Urban District Council, requiring them to pay the final quarterly instalment of the demand note for the year ending March 31st, amounting to £233 14s 4d. The Urban Council was repeatedly applied to for the money, and the proceedings were instituted by direction of the County Council.

The Lord Chief Justice—Why did they refuse to pay—is there any principle involved?  
Mr Mooney—I don't think there is any principle involved. I think it is mere neglect.  
Mr Justice Dodd—Have you had any actual refusal?  
Mr Mooney—No, my lord. I think it is a mere omission.  
The order was granted.
