TRAGIC AFFAIR IN WEST LIMERICK.

FARMER'S DEATH.

Wife and Son Arrested.

Early on Wednesday morning the body of named Thomas McCann, residing at Gort , West, a townland situate about a mile from n his own yard by his wife. They agreed that the fractures could have been caused by blows of some blunt instrument, and did not think they could be caused by a fall.

The jury returned a verdict in accordance with the medical evidence that deceased died as the result of fracture of the skull.
