Vienna, Thursday.—Reports received at Turazzo of the crucifixion of Mohammedan Albanians in the Orthodox Church at Kodra, are confirmed by the "Albanische Korrespondenz," which adds that nails were driven into the chests, hands, and feet of the victims. The children whom the Epirate insurgents found at Coriova were cruelly tortured, having fingers cut off.
