FUNERAL OF MR. ROBERT GIBSON.

On Sunday the funeral of Mr. Robert Gibson, whose death occurred on Friday morning, took place from his residence, Mulgrave Cottage. At 11 o'clock the coffin was taken out, and the large concourse of people present formed up and followed the bier to the railway station, the interment being at Douglas, Cork. The route taken by the procession was through William-street, George-street, and Glentworth-street, and as it passed along the large crowds on the sidewalks offered respectful reverence. The cortege was composed of every interest in the city, a prominent part being played by the G Company of the Irish National Volunteers, who walked on either side of the hearse. On arriving at the station the remains were transferred to the mortuary carriage on the 12.10 train en route for Cork, where the interment took place after the arrival of the train. The tribute of respect paid to the memory of the deceased by his fellow citizens of Limerick, where he was a popular figure for well-nigh half a century was fully deserved. In commercial circles he was esteemed by all who had business relations with him, while in social circles and as an advocate of everything which tended towards the welfare of the community he played a prominent and conspicuous part.
