A Trial Flight.

A consignment of twenty of the King's racing pigeons, valued at £700, was liberated from the North Pier, Bridlington, at five minutes past six his morning, and all the birds arrived at Sun- tringham by eight o'clock, giving an average velocity of 1,900 yards per minute. The birds will compete in the Serwick National Race.
