## Recent Greamery Fatality

#### Assistant Manager's Death

INQUEST RESUMED

THE JURY'S VERDICT

Coroner P. J. Cleary, M.D., and a jury of which Mr. John Jones, D.C., was foreman, resumed the inquest on John Carroll, Assistant Creamery Manager, who died on the 17th mst. from injuries received on that date at Bally-

vistes Creamery, where he was employed.

Dr. Clery, Hospital, gave evidence to the effect that deceased's arm was broken in three places, and he had also received an injury at the base of the skull, from which there was internal hemorrhage.

Other evidence was on the lines indicated in the report of the occurrence already published. Deceased had been called to see to some matter connected with the engine, and when he and the driver had given attention to it, deceased proceeded to put a driving belt from one pulley to another with a stick, there being no shifter attached, and while doing so his arm got caught in the spokes and he was pulled over an iron guard.

The jury returned a verdict in accordance with the medical testimony, and conveyed their sympathy to the relatives of the deseased in

their sad bereavement.
