At a largely attended meeting of the Mid-Tipperary Farmers' Association, held at Thurles, on Saturday, on the suggestion of Mr. H. M'Donagh, Agricultural Instructor under the Department, who delivered a very interesting lecture on the subject, it was decided to adopt a system of winter catch-cropping amongst the farmers of the district to provide against the scarcity of foodstuffs likely to result from the prolongation of the Continental wars.
