Mr. Robert Daly said he would resign in favour of Mr. Roche and if he were not elected he (Mr. Daly) would keep the position.

There being no amendment Mr. Roche was declared elected amid applause.

TRIM COUNCIL AND THE WAR

IMPORTANT RESOLUTION

On Saturday at the meeting of the Trim Board of Guardians and Trim Rural District Council, Mr. T. Flynn, Co.C., Chairman, presiding, the following resolution was passed unanimously:—"That we, the Trim R. D. C. and Board of Guardians of Trim Union, in meeting assembled, call on all Irishmen in America, Australia, etc., to come home to assist the Irish Nation in defence of their own country, and that we also request our friends across the sea to come equipped with the necessary war materials that enable them to do so; that copies of this resolution be sent to the President of the U.I.L., America; the Chairman of the Irish Party, and all Councils in Ireland."

Registration of Traction Engines

At the meeting of the County Council on Saturday, an item on the agenda to consider the solicitor's report re by-laws under the Public Roads (Ireland) Act, 1911, came on for consideration.
Mr. Hogan asked if the Council had drafted any by-laws re the registration of traction engines etc.
The Law Agent said he had drafted the by-laws which were submitted to the Local Government Board. The Board sent back the draft suggesting certain amendments and he had again returned them. The Local Government Board had the regulations for four months before returning them.
The matter dropped.

Transfer of Bank Manager

The removal of Mr. R. Johnson, Manager of Scariff National Bank, to fill a similar position in Gort, is much regretted in Scariff, where he was very popular.

The Chairman said the road to the south of Glin which was the main artery and where the greatest traffic it would want looking after.
Mr. Hartigan spoke of the state of this road and of the one to Ballybahill.
The County Surveyor said if they reduced the estimate their roads will suffer.
In reply to a suggestion of Mr. O'Shaughnessy, Co.C., as to working a gravel pit near the shore which contained a splendid supply and which would effect a saving of 1s 6d a yard in cost of material.
The County Surveyor said he would see to it. The estimate was adopted.
