Intermediate Education

Last Year's Figures

PLEA FOR BIGGER GRANTS

The annual report of the Intermediate Education Commissioners records an appreciable falling in the numbers that presented themselves for examination in 1913. The reduction, however, is entirely due to the discontinuance of the Preparatory Grade. The number of boys presenting themselves for examination was 6,154, as against 8,276 for the previous year, and for girls the figures were 3,552, as against 4,305 in 1912. A slightly larger percentage of girls was successful, the proportion being 53.6 per cent. of boys and 59.1 per cent. of girls, or an average all round of 55.6. In the distribution of the School Grant between the four provinces Leinster comes first with a total of £18,508 3s 6d for 1,170 schools; Ulster is second with £14,572 19s for 88 schools; Munster comes third with £13,100 for 92 schools, and Connaught was awarded £13,895 for 25 schools. IRISH VOLUNTEER REPUDIATED
A largely-attended meeting of the Provisional Committee of the Irish Volunteers was held on Friday night in the City Hall, Dublin. The proceedings were of a protracted character lasting from seven o'clock until almost half past eleven, when an adjournment took place.
