

DAIRY SHOW AWARDS AT ISLINGTON.

Irish Exhibits.

Entries for the annual Show of the British Farmers' Association, which opened on Monday at Islington, although slightly less than last year, totalled 7,107. There are comparatively few Irish exhibits and these are mainly in the dairy and poultry classes. In the butter classes awards were—For butter (free from salt) in boxes of 12 rolls—Ballymote Co-operative Society, 1st; Granagh Society, Ballingarry, 2nd; Ballyvictoria Society, Enniskillen, 4th. Mild cured butter (slightly salted)—Ballymote Society, 2nd; Ballyvictoria, 3rd; Glenwilliam Society, Ballingarry, 4th; Springfield, 5th; Ballyvictoria Society, highly commended. Cured butter (slightly salted)—Ballymote, 1st; Ballyvictoria, 2nd; Ballyvictoria, 3rd; Ballyvictoria Co-operative Society, 4th; Springfield, 5th; highly commended; Glenwilliam, commended. Lard—Ballymote, 1st; Ballyvictoria, 3rd; Ballyvictoria, 4th; Belleck, 5th. In a butter making contest Miss Helen M Moore, of the Munster Institute, Cork, took third prize.
