### Funeral of Dr. Holmes

The funeral of the late Dr. John Holmes, F.R.S.C.I., whose lamented death occurred last Friday, took place on Monday last, the interment being in the family burial place at Parteen. On Sunday night the coffin was removed to St. Michael's R.C. Church, where it rested overnight, and on Monday morning at half-past ten solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated for the dead.
