## Funeral of Dr. Holmes

The funeral of the late Dr. John Holmes, F.R.S.C.I., whose lamented death occurred last Friday, took place on Monday last, the interment being in the family burial place at Parteen. On Sunday night the coffin was removed to St. Michael's R.C. Church, where it rested overnight, and on Monday morning at half-past ten solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated for the dead. There was a large congregation present, and at the close of the service the remains were transferred to the hearse in waiting. At twelve o'clock the funeral left for the last resting place, proceeding by way of Patrick street and Rutland street. The cortege, notwithstanding the inclement weather, was of enormous dimensions, embracing representative citizens—the members of the medical and legal professions, mercantile interests, Corporation and Poor Law Board, with which the lamented deceased was officially connected for a long number of years. The extent of the cortege and its representative character was a fitting tribute of respect to the memory of an old and highly respected citizen, whose lofty attributes endeared him to a wide circle of friends and acquaintances.
