LIMERICK UNDERTAKER'S WILL

In the Probate Court yesterday, before Mr
 Justice Madden, in the case of Griffin v Dillon,
 Mr P Kelly (instructed by Mr Patrick E
 O'Donnell) applied on behalf of the plaintiff to
 have fixed the time and mode of trial of the action
 to establish the will of the late John Griffin,
 funeral undertaker, of Lower Gerald Griffin street,
 Limerick. The plaintiff, John Griffin, is the son
 and executor of the deceased, and the defendant is
 Catherine Dillon, a married daughter of deceased.
 The defendant seeks to oppose the will on the
 usual grounds, and also on the ground of undue
 influence alleged against the widow, who is dead,
 and two persons whose names are not mentioned.
 The assets of the testator are estimated to amount
 to about £1,800. Counsel asked to have particu-
 lars furnished in connection with the allegations of
 undue influence.

Mr Phelps (instructed by Mr Joseph Dodds)
 appeared for the defendant.

The trial of the action was fixed for Thursday,
 28th January, before a special jury, and the de-
 fendant was directed to furnish particulars with-
 in ten days.
